A nationally celebrated fabric artist, Melody Crust is renowned for her quilting talent. Her work has been shown in any number of juried shows and exhibitions, gathering awards as they go, and is coveted by private collectors around the world. She has traveled to virtually every part of the country, bringing her natural teaching ability and contagious enthusiasm to quilters everywhere. Her extremely popular lectures and workshops are always well received - students often return again and again for another helping of her expertise!

Her book, **Quilt Toppings; Fun and Fanciful Embellishment Techniques**, taps into the strong emerging trend toward embellishment of quilt surfaces. Paint, foil, paint sticks, thread, crayons, buttons, ribbons and beads are all readily available, fun, easy and non-messy ways to add that final design element to traditional and non-traditional quilts.

Melody has appeared on both television and radio. In addition to her book, **A Fine Line: Techniques and Inspirations for Creating the Quilting Design**, co-written with Heather Waldron, her quilts and writings have been featured in dozens of books, magazines and other publications, including *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine*, *Quilters World*, and *Patchwork Quilts*.

She is an active promoter of every facet of the quilting world. In addition to all of her other activities, she has judged and curated regional and national exhibitions and co-founded a major quilter's association in the Pacific Northwest. Melody and her husband, professional photographer Charles Crust, live in Kent, Washington.

Shirley Kinert was thanked for volunteering to be the Raffle Quilt Chair.

Members were informed that a new quilt stand will be purchased if the old one is not found.

Commendation was given to Bobbi Wodtli for the wonderful newsletter.

The September 22 minutes were approved as published.

The 2010 budget was approved as published.



Committee reports: **Hospice** - quilt labels are available; **Library** – We have 551 books, novels and videos. Please return overdue books. **Raffle tickets** are available for sale; **Doll Project** – 34 doll bundles have been delivered and 33 more are ready. More quilts are needed before Christmas. **In House** – Block packets are ready for sewing and should be returned by the Nov. meeting. A workshop to sew will be held on Dec. 3 at the Kingston Quilt Shop. **Quilt Show volunteers** – Members are needed to sell raffle tickets, help in the office area, door security, kitchen, row hostesses, members' boutique, front door, and set-up. **Classes** – There is one spot open for the next class and several openings for January classes. **Quilt Show** – There will be 3 judges per quilt category. The letter for catalog ads will be mailed Nov. 16. Guild members receive a \$5 discount on ads. The next quilt show committee meeting is at Heirloom Quilts, Nov. 19, at 5:30 p.m. **Quilt Registration** – Members may register on line or by mail. On line registrants will receive an email reply. Those registering by mail should send only one copy. **Props** – A chairperson is needed. **Gadget Library** – The following items will be given away tonight: all-in-one ruler, Starmaker 6 ruler, Martelli binding tools.

**Apron Exchange:** Those members wanting to make an apron signed up. Members drew names for the apron project. The aprons will be worn by the workers at the quilt show.

**New Member Tea:** Permission has been granted to park in the Lutheran Church parking lot since parking at the restaurant is minimal.

**Fabric Exchange:** 32 fat quarters were turned in. Winners of the drawing were Karen O'Grady and Carolyn Nannery. Next month's theme is "Bountiful Harvest." Material should be food fabrics (no animals or fish).

After the break, Betsy Laultt introduced the speaker, Nancy Martin. Several slides were viewed and quilts shown.

## **KITSAP QUILTERS NEEDS YOU TO VOLUNTEER FOR THE QUILT SHOW IN FEB. 2009**

The Standing Rules for our guild states "Each member is encouraged to work a minimum of 4 hours on each Quilt Show." There are jobs that require working before the quilt show but this article is about the jobs that need to be filled to make OUR Quilt Show run smoothly in Feb.

On the day you work, you get into the quilt show FREE.

THURSDAY morning the quilts are hung in the President Hall at the Kitsap Fair grounds. This is done in teams of 2 or 3 people, and there is something for everyone to do even if you haven't a clue at the beginning. It is a fun process to see the show take form. We will also need someone to photograph each quilt at the end with all the ribbons attached, so Thursday evening.

FRIDAY AND SATURDAY positions are (1) Front Door - to greet the people, collect the entrance fee, pass out the programs and answer any questions. (2) Raffle Tickets - sit and sell raffle tickets. (3) Office Area - sit and tell the volunteers where they have been assigned, guard the volunteers purses etc. (4) Door Security - sit or stand and see that no one comes into the show illegally or leaves with a quilt. This job you can visit with the guests, sew or read a book but NO sleeping. (5) Row Hostess - walking around the rows of quilts, answering questions, wearing a cotton glove to show the back of a quilt. (6) Vendor Helpers - sit in for a vendor if they need a break, bring them a meal etc. (7) Kitchen Crew - take the order, take the payment, make the sandwiches, stir the soup, deliver the customers lunch to their table, clean tables as needed. (8) Those who sell items in the members' boutique are encouraged to put in hours there.

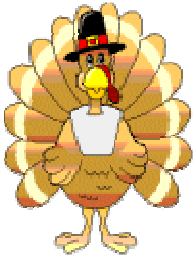
### **SATURDAY AFTER THE SHOW**

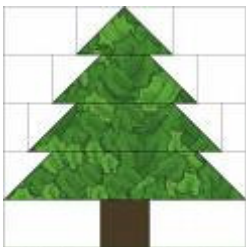

## CHRISTMAS BLOCK EXCHANGE

It's time to start those blocks for our Christmas Exchange! We had a wonderful turn-out last year of 47 sets of blocks and hope for the same participation this year!

How:

- ❖ Blocks are 6 1/2" unfinished of a Christmas motif.
- ❖ Blocks are for a standard horizontal setting; not for an on-point setting.
- ❖ Make 15 blocks for the exchange and turn them in with your name on the back of the block printed in the margin.
- ❖ Please put your blocks in a zip lock gallon bag with your name in black marker on the outside of the bag.
- ❖ You may make 16 blocks if you wish to keep (1) for yourself.
- ❖ You may make 2 sets of blocks if you wish to get 30 back in the exchange.
- ❖ Blocks will be distributed based on degree of difficulty. If you wish to get a series of 15 blocks back that were more difficult to make; then you must turn in blocks that are above average in difficulty such as a mariner's star or a hand appliquéd block with many pieces. It is acceptable to use fusible interface under your motif but please stitch it down. Embellishments are always appreciated. If you turn in a square in a square, that will be considered an average block. Blocks made on an embroidery machine will be accepted and judged as to degree of difficulty. Please use your best materials that will not shrink or run in the wash. No four patch blocks will be accepted.
- ❖ Blocks that are smaller than 6 1/2" cannot be accepted.



When: Blocks are due at the November meeting or before.

Where: Fifteen or thirty blocks will be returned to you at the December Christmas Party. If you will not be there, please ask someone to pick up your blocks for you or we will call you and bring your blocks to the January 2010 meeting.

### *Guilt Auction or Flea Market?*

If you've been quilting for at least a month, chances are you have already begun to accumulate a "stash." And sooner or later you will realize that a piece of fabric that looked wonderful when you bought it no longer appeals to you. Or maybe you have a pattern that you no longer want to use, or a sewing gadget that has served its purpose for you. A guilt auction or a sewers flea market can provide a way to gain some space in your sewing room and relieve yourself of the nagging "guilt" caused by seeing those unwanted items.

In a guilt auction each seller displays items for sale by silent auction, or if the price asked is \$25 or more, by live auction. For members, 20% of proceeds goes to the Guild and 80% to the seller. For non-members the percentage to the Guild is 30%. In a flea market, each seller pays a fixed price for a certain area of display space and then sells directly, keeping all of the proceeds.

At the November meeting we will ask you to tell us which of these selling methods you would like the Guild to organize for the April meeting. If you will not be at the meeting, please send me an e-mail or call me with your preference.

**Display:** Having your quilt judged is **optional**. If you do not wish your entry to be judged, simply mark the box “Display.” “Display” items may be entered in any of the categories listed. Judges will skip over entries marked “Display.” Display entries are eligible for the “Viewers Choice” ribbon and in the Challenge category.

**Challenge:** Literature of the 1950s. The maximum size of Challenge entries is 120 inches perimeter. As in the past Challenge entries will be voted upon by guild members at the January guild meeting.

**For Sale:** If you wish your entry to be listed “for sale,” please mark the box on the entry form and be sure to provide all of the necessary details, including price, to Member’s Boutique chairs who will oversee the sale of member’s items during the show. The guild is to receive 10% of the sale price of member items sold at the quilt show.

**How to submit your entry:** Complete a separate entry form for each item you wish to enter in the quilt show. Make and keep a copy for your records before sending your entry form. Entries may be sent as an email attachment to [notyme2quilt@msn.com](mailto:notyme2quilt@msn.com) or by US mail to Karen Knowlton, 923 - 19<sup>th</sup> Street, Port Townsend, WA 98368 – one copy only - and with a SASE (self-addressed, stamped envelope) if mailed. Karen will return a numbered ID form to you. This ID form is to be attached to, and remain with, your entry until it is returned to you after the show. (If you are able to attach your completed entry form as an email attachment to Karen that should work.)

**Sleeves:** 4-inch sleeves are required on all quilts wider than 24 inches. If the width of your quilt is more than 118 inches, or is an unusual shape such as round, star, etc., a sleeve is not required. Oversized quilts (note size) will need to be folded and pinned to conform to the width and length of display space.

**Hanging Instructions:** If the top of your quilt is not clear, be sure to mark “top.”

**Under Comments:** (maximum 35 words) In addition to what inspired you to make the entry, give credit to the source of the pattern, technique, or method. Tell about special techniques used (embellishments, adornments, thread painting, etc.), and be sure to give credit to participants in a Group entry – especially the name of the quilter. Also tell for whom the quilt was made. If your “story” is more extensive, you may wish to type a separate write-up and slip it into a plastic binder sleeve so that it can be displayed with your quilt at the quilt show.

**Deadline:** All entry forms must be received by Karen Knowlton no later than January 15, 2010.

**Withdrawals:** If, after submitting your entry form, your item must be withdrawn for any reason, inform Karen Knowlton as soon as possible. She, in turn, must notify Geniene Welch (in charge of show hanging) and Bonnie Isaacs (in charge of show catalog), and likely others.

**Drop-off Instructions:** Between February 13 - 16 your entry items are to be taken to one of the drop-off locations listed by Andrea Rudman, Drop-Off chair. Each entry must have the numbered ID form sent to you by Karen. This ID form is to be attached to your quilt/entry and remain there until it is returned to you after the show.

**Safety:** Be sure that your name is on your entry items. It is also wise to photograph your entry before taking it to a drop-off location.

Quilt show entry is open to all members of the Kitsap Quilt Guild.

- Miscellaneous.** Accessories, purses, hats, baby bibs, scarves, totes, table runners, placemat sets, tree skirts, pillows, etc.
