## ***uilters without Borders - Mongolian Outreach Update***

Our dream of purchasing a new community center in Ulaanbaatar to house the Mongolian Quilting Center and help low income and unemployed women has become a reality! Selenge Tserendash has the keys - she is so happy and excited and thanks all of you who have supported this project. The new Center is a street level apartment with its own entryway and two rooms plus bathroom and kitchen. The rooms are larger than those in the current Center. The larger room is approximately 15' x 10', and the other about 12' x 9'. The smaller room faces the street and will be used as their retail outlet, and the big room will be the classroom. The place has the potential for expansion in the future - it could be built out to create a third room and it would also be possible to dig out the basement. The location is excellent - across the street from the Mongolian BBQ on Seoul Street (a major road leading out of the center of Ulaanbaatar and only about 10 minutes walk from the heart of the city). It is very close to the current Center, Selenge's apartment, her parent's apartment and the basement where the seamstresses make items to sell. Selenge is very happy - I may have mentioned that already!

We have raised \$79,000 and the cost of the new Center is \$78,500. Our capital campaign officially closes on 5th October when we will draw the winning tickets for our silk raffle piece and the national guilds contest. We have one more fund raising event, a benefit concert on 28th September at 4.00 p.m. at Rolling Bay Presbyterian Church on Bainbridge Island. Local women musicians will perform to raise money to help women, and the proceeds will be split between the YWCA Alive Shelter in Bremerton and the Mongolia project. You are all invited to attend. Funds raised between now and then, (we hope to raise another \$2-3,000), will be used for moving costs, lino flooring, paint, new doors, display cabinets for the retail outlet and for some new furniture. The timing of all this is perfect - Selenge has one month in which to prepare the new Center. The lease on the old Center runs out at the end of September, and they will be able to move straight into the new Center before the beginning of October, and before winter sets in.

I'd like to personally thank you for the support you have given, both as a guild and as individuals. This project has benefited from the contributions of many, and we couldn't have achieved our goal without you. It is so exciting to see it come to fruition, and the Mongolian women are most appreciative.

## *CHRISTMAS BLOCKS*

**When:** Blocks are due at the November meeting or before. I will begin accepting blocks in September for you over-achievers.

**Where:** Fifteen or thirty blocks will be returned to you at the December Christmas Party. If you will not be there, please ask someone to pick up your blocks for you, otherwise, I will call you and bring your blocks to the January, 2009 meeting for you. After that, I guess they are mine. Just kidding.

It's time to start those blocks for our Christmas Exchange!

### **How:**

- Blocks are 6 1/2" unfinished of a Christmas motif.
- Blocks are for a standard horizontal setting; not for an on-point setting.
- Make 15 blocks for the exchange and turn them in with your name on the back of the block printed in the margin.

Please put your blocks in a sandwich bag with your name in black marker on the outside of the bag.

- You may make 16 blocks if you wish to keep (1) for yourself.
- You may make 2 sets of blocks if you wish to get 30 back in the exchange.
- Blocks will be distributed based on degree of difficulty. If you wish to get a series of 15 blocks back that were more difficult to make; then you must turn in blocks that are above average in difficulty such as a mariner's star or a hand appliquéd block with many pieces. If you turn in a square in a square, that will be considered an average block. Blocks made on an embroidery machine will be counted as average.
- No 4 patch blocks will be accepted.
- Blocks that are smaller than 6 1/2" will not be accepted.

## **SHOOFLY BLOCK....LAST MONTH.....LAST CHANCE**

Many of you may have heard the news that Jennifer Pielow and family have moved to Omaha, Nebraska. Jennifer has been our Web mistress for at least the last eight years. There isn't one of us who hasn't been touched by her volunteer work whether it was setting up and maintaining the KQ Website, answering web questions, or photographing quilts in our quilt shows. Please take some time to create a quilt block to show your appreciation. **She likes bright colors.** The directions follow:

**Shoo Fly Quilt Block** (From the Better Homes & Gardens book: Grandma's Best Full Sized Quilt Blocks)

Unfinished block size: 9-1/2 inches, made from nine 3-1/2 inch squares.

You may use a light/medium, OR a medium/dark color combination. The lighter color will be color A; the darker of the two colors will be color B.

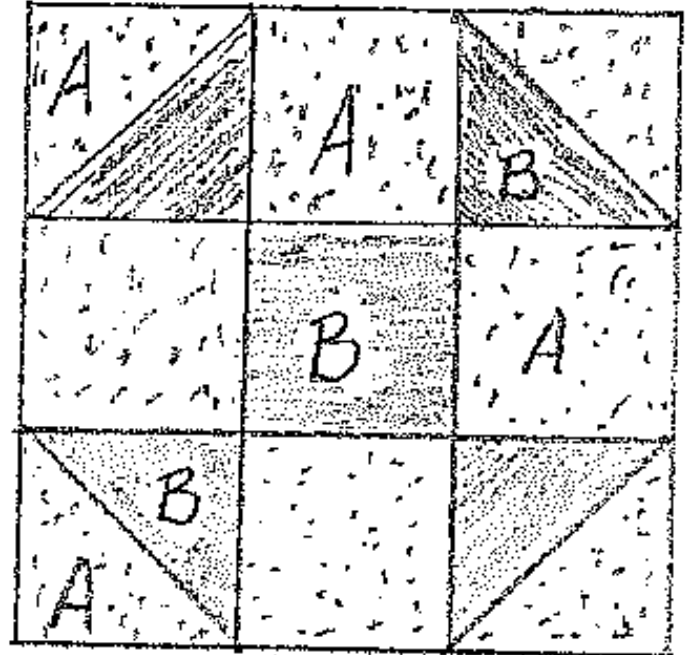
First, cut 2 light and 2 dark of colors A and B to be 3-7/8th inches.

- Place one each, light and dark fabric, right sides together and make four Half Square triangles. These will form the four corners of the block. The darker triangles will be pointing toward the center square.

For the remainder squares, cut one 3-1/2 inch, dark center (B), and four 3-1/2 inch, light squares (A) for the center edges of the block.

Sew the squares together to form a Nine Patch, with all dark triangles (B) pointing in toward the center, dark square (B).

See the diagram below. Please use 1/4 in. seams; iron the joined seams in each row toward the darker color. Check for an unfinished 9-1/2 inch block.



Please sign your block on the light fabric next to the diagonal seam on any half square triangle.

I'm sure Jennifer will be thrilled with our good wishes and thanks.

You may turn your blocks in to me at the September (membership renewal) meeting. I will mail the blocks by Sept. 30 so you could mail any to me before that date.

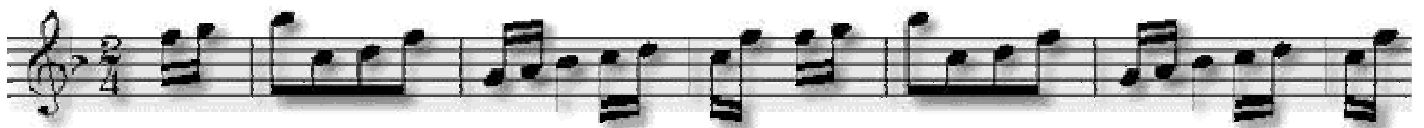

## 2009 CHALLENGE QUILT

### Theme: Music

Music is something that is integral in our lives. Choose a song from any source or era--with or without words. Think of the myriad of melodies and lyrics we have to draw from, and inspire us. Make a quilt in any style you like that reflects your song. Your quilt can be traditional, or an art quilt--but most importantly, your own creation using techniques and materials of your choice--piecing, whole cloth, embellishments, painting, stamping, stenciling, etc. The quilt should be constructed in the usual 3 layers. Let your imagination be your guide!

48" x 48"--any shape or size, as long as it fits within this limitation.
